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A brief story of Vishnu's 6th Avatar ''Parashuram'' followed by a quiz

In Treta Yuga, many Kshatriya kings were cruel, tyrannic, and had given up principles of dharma. Due to this, people were suffering and so was 'dharma'. There were a lot of bloodsheds and Bhumadevi (Mother Earth) went to Vishnu for help. It was Lord Vishnu who safeguards the world whenever adharma reigns.

Lord Vishnu came to Earth as the youngest son of rishi Jamadagni and Renuka. He was named as Ram (not to be confused with Ram from the Ramayana).

Sage Jamadagni meditated and prayed to Brahma as he was finding it difficult to feed his family. Brahma bestowed upon him with a cow called Kamadhenu. Kamadhenu was no ordinary cow, it had the ability to provide delicious food for many people.

Ram performed meditation and austerities (Tapasya) and received "parashu" (परशु = axe) from Lord Shiva. Since then his name "Ram" got prefixed with "parashu" and he came to be known as Parashuram. Parashu (axe) was the weapon that brought victory to him in all the battles.

Karthaveeriya Arjuna was a powerful Kshatriya but a very cruel and mean king. Once he was traveling with his army close to the Reva river. He went to Maharishi Jamadagni's ashram with thousands of his soldiers.



Sage Jamadagni was able to provide food for the whole army with the help of his Kamadhenu cow. King Karthaveeriya was thoroughly impressed with Kamadhenu. He had not tasted such delicious food ever in his life.

He wanted to acquire Kamadhenu for himself. Sage Jamadagni refused to part with the cow as it was given to him by Brahma. The King Karthaveeriya took Kamadhenu forcefully from Jamadagni.

When Parashuram heard about the king's atrocity, he went and fought with Karthaveeriya and his army. He singlehandedly destroyed Karthaveeriya and his army with the help of his axe. He got his Kamadhenu safely back to the ashram.

Meanwhile, Karthaveeriya's sons were plotting to take their revenge. They came with their army to Jamadagni's ashram when Parashuram was out on pilgrimage. Karthaveeriya's sons and their army killed Sage Jamadagni. When Parashuram came to know about it, he got very angry with Kshatriyas for their abuse of power and arrogance. He cremated his father's body and vowed to clean up the Kshatriyas' misrule. He went on to kill Karthaveeriya's sons and many adharmic Kshatriya kings to install dharma and righteousness on earth.

Parashuram believed that people and society should fight against injustice. Parashuram was a brahmin and his fight was not against a particular cast or a clan but against ruling Kshatriyas who were misusing their power. The existence of Lord Parashuram can be found in Ramayana (Parashuram meeting Ram) and in Mahabharata also (as a guru of Bhishma and Karna). Lord Parashuram is a Chiranieevi (immortal living beings in Hinduism who are to remain alive on Earth until the end of Kali Yuga).Now it's time to answer some interesting questions - QUIZ about Parashuram Avatar is on the next page . . .

Quiz on Vishnu's 6th Avatar, "Parashuram"

Question 1: Parashuram heard the sound of Lord Shiva's bow getting broken. He said "Another Kshatriya's misdeed? Which Kshatriya has the audacity to break the bow of Lord Shiva? He will be punished for this". Who had broken Lord Shiva's bow and why?

Question 2: Parashuram will never train a Kshatriya as he was not in favor of empowering them with his training. Why did he agree to teach Karna?

Question 3: Who stopped Parashuram when he wanted to meet Lord Shiva after defeating King Karthaveeriya Arjuna?

Question 4: Why Bhishma had to fight with his guru Parashuram?

Question 5: Who won the fight between Bhishma and Parashuram?

Question 6: Why did Parashuram accept Bhishma as his student when he was against teaching Kshatriyas?

Answers to the Quiz

Answer 1: It was Dashrath's son Ram who had broken Lord Shiva's bow at the swayamvar of Sita. But when Parashuram saw Ram, he knew that he was Vishnu's avatar. He asked Ram to pardon him.

Answer 2:. Karna had to lie that he was a Brahmin and got trained by Parashuram. One day Parashuram was resting on Karna's lap. An insect bit Karna but he did not make any noise and remained still so that he does not disturb his guru Parashuram's sleep. When Parashuram saw the pain tolerance & bravery of Karna, he came to know that Karna was a Kshatriya, not a brahmin. Karna apologized for his lie which was a grave sin. Parashuram pardoned and did not kill him but cursed him that Karna will not be able to use his skills when he needs it the most. In the war of Mahabharata, Karna was killed by Arjun while he was trying to free the wheel of his chariot which had gotten stuck. Karna was unable to use his skills taught by Parashuram to protect himself.

Answer 3: Baby Ganesha stopped Parashuram because his father, Lord Shiva, was meditating. By his nature, Parashuram was enraged that he was being prevented from seeing Lord Shiva, and so he started fighting Lord Ganesha. During the fight, Parashuram threw his axe at Shri Ganesha due to which one of his tusk got chopped off. Ganesha didn't defend himself because the axe was a gift from Lord Shiva.

Answer 4: Amba demanded Bhishma to marry her, but Bhishma declined due to his vow of celibacy. Enraged at her humiliation, Amba got Parashuram (Bhishma's guru), to champion her cause. Bhishma made his guru Parashuram furious by declining to marry Amba due to his celibacy vow.

Answer 5: Parashuram was on the verge of a defeat when Ganga stepped in to put the matter to rest.

Answer 6: Bhishma (or Devavrata) was the son of Goddess Ganga. So Parashuram had no reason not accept him as his student. Ganga is also the wife of Lord Shiva and Parashuram was an ardent devotee of Lord Shiva, so Parashuram could not say no to Ganga when she asked Parashuram to be the guru of Bhishma. Another important reason is that Parashuram hated Kshatriya rulers but Bhishma though was a Kshatriya but vowed to his father that he will never become a king.
