
The event was also a great opportunity to reflect back on the impacts of Hindu Satsang's Sunday School.


A big congratulation to our own Dr. Subhash Pandey!

- 7. If your answer was 3 then sorry, this was kind of a trick question our tiranga (tricolor or Indian flag) actually has 4 colors. The National Flag of India is a horizontal rectangular tricolor of deep saffron, white, and green; with the Ashoka Chakra, a 24-spoke wheel, in navy blue at its center.
- 8. Ivory Coast, Niger, and Ireland
- The top band is saffron, which represents strength and courage. The middle part is white, which denotes the honesty, purity, and peace of the nation. The bottom band is green, indicating prosperity, fertility, and growth.
- 10. The wheel is called the Ashok Chakra because it appears on a number of edicts of Ashoka, the most prominent among which is the Lion Capital of Ashoka. Each spoke on the chakra symbolizes one principle of life and also the twenty-four hours in the day.




This connection with Hanuman Ji and Ram Ji provides inner strength and helps overcome any hurdles in life.


