

Vishnu's 7th avatar - Shri Ram, the eldest son of Dashrath and the prince of Ayodhya, won the hand of the beautiful princess Sita, daughter of King Janak. Shri Ram was exiled along with his wife Sita and his brother Laksman for 14 years by the plotting of his stepmother Kaikeyi. In the forest, Sita was abducted by Lanka's powerful but arrogant King Ravan. Shri Ram gathered an army of vanaras and bears to search for his wife. The allies attacked Lanka, killed Ravana, and rescued Sita. After the couple's triumphant return to Ayodhya, Rama's righteous rule inaugurated a golden age for all mankind.

Quiz Time - Now is the time for some questions about Vishnu's 7th Avatar - Shri Ram:

1. Name two characters who appear in Ramayan, as well as in Mahabharat.

2. During Ram and Sita's grand marriage ceremony, brothers of Shri Ram -Lakshman, Bharat, and Shatrughan also got married to Sita's sisters and cousins. What were their names?

3. Though the original is believed to be the work of sage Valmiki, there are also other versions written by many other saints and Veda pundits such as the great Awadhi poet, Goswami Tulsidas. What was the name of the Ramayan written by Sant Tulsidas?

4. What was Valmiki's livelihood while growing up, well before he started writing Ramayan?

5. What festival do we celebrate 20 days after Dussehra, to commemorate the triumphant return of Shri Ram to Ayodhya?

Answers to Shri Ram Quiz

1. Parashuram (Vishnu's 6th avatar) and Hanuman. There are seven people who are immortal according to Hindu texts, they are called chiranjeevis (चिरंजीवी). Both Hanuman and Parashuram are chiranjeevis, which enabled them to be present during the two distant events in history.

2. During Ram and Sita's grand marriage ceremony, brothers of Shri Ram -Lakshman, Bharat and Shatrughan were also married to Sita's sister - Urmila, and cousins Mandavi, and Shuddhakirti respectively.

3. Ramcharitmanas (literally means "Lake of deeds of Ram"). It was written by Sant Goswami Tulsidas in 1633. He wanted the story of Shri Ram to be available to the general public. At that time, not many people could understand Sanskrit, hence they could not read the original Ramayan. That is why Tulsidas wrote Ramcharitmanas in Awadhi language.

4. When Valmiki grew up, he became a hunter like his foster father but also took to being a bandit to supplement his livelihood. Once it so happened he met the Maharishi Narada and tried to rob him. However, Narada converted him into a 'Brahmarishi' or religious scholar. He narrated the story of Rama (Ramayana) to him and asked him to write it down for posterity. Valmiki did penance for many years and an ant-hill grew around him. Hence his new name 'Valmiki' which in Sanskrit means an anthill. Valmiki was not his birth name. His actual name was Ratnakara, which was given by his birth parents.

5. We celebrate Diwali to commemorate the triumphant return of Shri Ram to Ayodhya (this year it is on Saturday, November 14th). Wish you all a very Happy Diwali!



Vijayadashmi or Dusshera is celebrated on the tenth day of the Hindu autumn lunar month of Ashvin. The first nine days are celebrated as Maha Navratri (nine nights).

The day marks the victory of Goddess Durga over such demons as Shumbh and Nishumbh. It is a day when devotees worship Goddess Shakti. Shakti represents strength, ability and courage. This day also celebrates the victory of Lord Rama over the demon king Ravana.

Dussehra is derived from Sanskrit Dasha-hara meaning "remover of bad fate" meaning remover of ten heads of Ravana's; and this festival is also referred to as Navratri and Durgotsav.

May Goddess Durga remove your bad fate and give you success & happiness in your endeavours! Happy Dussehra!
